This new dojo is about two and a half times bigger than the current mat space and has four times the number of shower and washroom facilities. We are very excited about this next chapter in the growth of AYNSW. This move will see our dojo established in a vibrant and developing family-friendly area of Sydney with great potential to make new ties with the local community.

Housekeeping

With the new dojo still undergoing construction and growing as more mats are eventually laid down, it can be confusing with the proper etiquette of where/when to bow. To help clarify this and other things around the dojo:

- One standing bow towards *Shomen* (the front) anytime you step **on or off** the wooden boards that will eventually become the walkway.
- Coming onto the mats bow in *seiza* (kneeling position) towards *Shomen*.
- If you come onto the mats after the class has started, bow to *Shomen* first, and wait for the Sensei to see you then bow and "Osu" to each other. If the Sensei does not notice you run up closer to the Sensei then bow.
- On the mats remember to always refer to the instructor as *Sensei*.
- Please make sure you are adequately hydrated before the class and have a bottled drink with you. The kitchenette area will eventually become a private area, so if you need water there will be cups provided in the washroom sinks area.
- The drinks fridge is for the sale of AYNSW drinks **only**. Please **do not** store your opened bottles in the fridge.

Public Holidays

Please note that the dojo will be closed in April for the following public holidays:

Easter Weekend: Fri. April 2nd to Mon. April 5th. Training resumes Tuesday April 6th.

ANZAC Day Weekend: Sat. April 24th to Mon. April 26th. AYNSW will be attending the Chida Sensei Seminar in Melbourne this weekend so the dojo will be shut on the Saturday as well as the Monday. Training resumes Tuesday April 27th.

Schedule Change

Please note that on Tuesday April 6th there will be no afternoon class 1:00 – 2:00.

Wednesday 7am class will start soon, but not until major work on the new dojo has been completed, sometime after Easter.
