## **Hansei (Reflections)**

It is four and a half years since we opened AYNSW in Alexandria. At that time there was no Yoshinkan Aikido in NSW, but we set out to plant the flag and promote Yoshinkan as best we could.

Since then we have hosted Joe Thambu Sensei from Aikido Shudokan Melbourne twice, Robert Mustard Sensei of Canada, Inoue Sensei and Takeno Sensei. People have come to know of Yoshinkan Aikido through these events, demonstrations and seminars. I think everyone can be proud of the combined dojo effort that has gone into making every seminar and demonstration such a huge success. If aikido is the art of cooperation leading to success, then as a team we have shown this trait time and time again.

My vision for AYNSW was a dojo that would attract people from all walks of life. They come together from diverse backgrounds, working together to learn and apply aikido techniques on each other in a spirit of cooperative harmony.

The outcomes of aikido training are both short & long term. Short term we see an increase in stamina, balance, flexibility and coordination. We learn about ourselves as we struggle to overcome simple hurdles like learning to fall safely, learning to move swiftly and smoothly. As we progress we become more attuned to ourselves and those we are training with. We develop an affinity with Japanese language & culture and our understanding of personal security and self-defense grows.

Longer term we come to respect all around us, as we know that everyone has a skill or talent that is above our own. By committing to one activity and attempting to master it, we have limited our resources in other areas. We learn to recognize this and appreciate each and everyone for their own talents and skills, whether they are in martial arts, the arts, commerce or other. The pursuit of excellence is the common thread, a thread that has a starting point but no end. This is what it is to apply ourselves to Budo. To

constantly re-evaluate and improve on our last training effort. It is important that we keep this feeling, that of novice pioneers, as we move forward into the next stage of our growth as an organization striving for excellence.
